Arlington is located in Tarrant County, and is part of the Mid-Cities region of the Dallas-Fort Worth-Arlington metropolitan area, approximately 12 miles east of downtown Fort Worth and 20 miles west of downtown Dallas.

According to the U.S. Census Bureau's estimate, the city had a population of 398,112 in 2018, making it the second-largest city in the county (after Fort Worth) and the third largest in the metropolitan area. Arlington is the forty-eighth-most populous city in the United States, the seventh-most populous city in the state of Texas, and the largest city in the state that is not a county seat.

Choctaw Stadium (formerly known as Globe Life Park in Arlington)

Home to the Texas Rangers for 25 plus years, Arlington. This former home to the Texas Rangers ball club is a 270-acre multi-purpose complex with over 48,000 open-air seats that has played host to two World Series games and the 1995 All-Star Game.

The architecture of Choctaw Stadium fuses state-of-the-art amenities with a respect for the grand tradition of America's pastime. In 2020, the original Choctaw Stadium layout was reconfigured to also be utilized as a football and soccer facility. Features of the park include a granite and brick facade, a home run porch in right field, and an asymmetrical playing field, a common characteristic of early 20th-century ballparks. The playing field is comprised of real grass, a luxuriant Tifway 419 turf. And, of course, the Lone Star features prominently on the exterior and interior of the park, a symbol of Texan pride. Choctaw Stadium is also available for public and private events, hosting anything from concerts to banquets.

Top O' Hill Terrace

Beulah Adams Marshall bought land along the Bankhead Highway in the early 1920s and opened a tea room, hosting teas and serving dinners to Dallas and Fort Worth patrons. In the late 1920s, Fred and Mary Browning purchased the property and shortly began converting the facilities into a casino, adding an escape tunnel and secret room for hiding the gambling paraphernalia during raids. The popular spot attracted gamblers as well as visitors who were often unaware of the gaming activities. Many of the historic structures from the days of Top O' Hill remain today on this site.
