### **Miller Springs Nature Center**

Hwy 2271 North of Lake Belton Spillway The Nature Center is a 260-acre scenic natural area in the historic Tennessee Valley, which is located in the cities of Belton and Temple. The nature preserve is open to the public, at no charge, each day of the year. Visitors enjoy hiking and biking this parkland, which has more than 10 miles of trails divided into several loops.

## Parks

#### **Chisholm Trail Park**

3115 Dunns Canyon Road Located behind Belton High School. It features baseball fields, soccer fields, basketball courts, a large covered area, a butterfly garden, and a .79-mile walking trail. At 34.19 acres, this is the second largest park in Belton.

### Harris Community Park

312 N. Alexander Street The park has a playground, benches, and a Splash Pad. It is situated along the Nolan Creek Hike and Bike Trail and includes a butterfly garden, restrooms, and several picnic tables.

#### Heritage Park

1502 Park Avenue

Belton's largest park, at 155 acres. It has athletic fields, picnic tables, grills, a community garden, two pavilions, fishing dock, a special needs accessible playground, and more.

### Liberty Park


700 Veterans Way Park has two pavilions, several picnic tables, two playground areas, and lots of open green space. The Nolan Creek Hike and Bike Trail runs through Liberty Park. The park is 16.5 acres.

#### **Miller Heights Park**

2495 S. Miller Street Park has picnic tables, grills, a playground, basketball court, fitness station, and .59 miles of walking trails. It also has a butterfly garden, and open green space. The park is 6.2 acres.

## Yettie Polk Park

101 S. Davis Street This park is one of Belton's oldest and most highly utilized parks. It is situated along Nolan Creek and features two playgrounds, picnic tables, seating, basketball courts, and ample parking. The Hike and Bike Trail (the crown jewel of the Belton Park System) runs through the park. This park is about 8 acres in size.
