Clarksville, a historic neighborhood in west Austin, Texas, stands as a testament to African American resilience and cultural preservation. Founded in 1871 by freed slave Charles Clark, it emerged as one of the oldest freedmen's towns west of the Mississippi River, providing a haven for former slaves in the post-Civil War era.

Throughout its history, Clarksville faced numerous challenges, including segregation and discrimination in the early 20th century, and later threats of destruction from urban renewal projects and highway construction. However, the community's strong activism in the mid-20th century successfully preserved the neighborhood, leading to its addition to the National Register of Historic Places in 1976.

Today, Clarksville is cherished for its historic homes, tight-knit community, and ongoing efforts to maintain its rich African American heritage, serving as a living link to an important chapter in Texas and American history.
