

Denton's A-train

Denton's A-train is a 21-mile commuter rail line operated by the Denton County Transportation Authority, running between the Downtown Denton Transit Center and the Trinity Mills Station in Carrollton, where it connects with the DART Green Line. Designed to offer a convenient and modern transit option for residents, students, and commuters, the A-train parallels I-35E and serves multiple stops throughout Denton County, providing an easy link to the greater Dallas area. With frequent service Monday through Saturday, free-fare zones at select stations, and seamless access to DART connections, the A-train has become an essential part of Denton's transportation network.

Bayless-Selby House Museum

The Bayless-Selby House Museum resides in the Denton County Historical Park. Built in 1898, this Queen Anne-style house depicts life in Denton County before 1908.

Campus Theatre -Texas State Historical Marker

Denton's Historic Campus Theatre is a beloved cultural landmark in downtown Denton, Texas, originally built in 1949 as a state-of-the-art movie house serving the nearby UNT and Texas Woman's University communities. Designed in the Art Moderne style with its distinctive neon accents and geometric façade, it operated as a cinema until 1985 before later being restored and transformed into a thriving performing arts venue managed by Theatre Denton. Today, the Campus Theatre hosts live productions, film festivals, and community events, continuing its long legacy as one of Denton's most iconic gathering places.

Courthouse-on-the-Square Museum

Built in 1896, the Denton County Courthouse is one of the county's most iconic landmarks and anchors the downtown square. Restored in 2004 using architect W.C. Dodson's original blueprints, it features materials ranging from local limestone to pink granite and regional sandstone. Today, it houses the Courthouse-on-the-Square Museum and John B. Denton's grave, hosting year-round exhibits and community events that keep its history alive.

Denton Firefighters' Museum

The Denton Firefighters Museum, located in the historic Central Fire Station, invites visitors to explore more than 150 years of firefighting history through memorabilia ranging from an 1800s hose cart and 1935 ladder-truck equipment to vintage extinguishers, helmets, uniforms, and fire logs from the 1920s. Life-like mannequins displaying gear from different eras help bring the evolution of the profession to life, honoring the dedication and bravery of firefighters past and present.

Clear Creek Natural Heritage Center

Clear Creek Natural Heritage Center in Denton, Texas, offers a serene escape into more than 2,900 acres of protected bottomland forests, upland prairies, and aquatic habitats. Located within Lake Lewisville's upper floodplain and managed by the City of Denton, the center was established to conserve rare ecosystems while providing ecological, educational, and recreational opportunities for visitors. With over 10 miles of family-friendly trails winding through wetlands, forests, and open prairie, it's a popular destination for hikers, nature lovers, and wildlife observers seeking an immersive outdoor experience.

Denton Skate Park

The skate park is free and open daily from 6am to 10am, closing only for scheduled clinics and camps. It features a variety of ramps and rails at different heights, including a corner bowl, 3-foot and 5-foot half pipes, a fun box with a half-pyramid, and a separate area designed for beginners.

The Greenbelt Corridor

The Greenbelt Corridor is a 20-mile multi-use trail stretching along the Elm Fork Branch of the Trinity River, offering 12 miles for equestrians and 10 miles for bicyclists and hikers as it runs from below the Ray Roberts Dam to the headwaters of Lake Lewisville. Operated by Texas Parks and Wildlife, this popular nature route provides a natural playground for hiking, biking, horseback riding, rollerblading, geocaching, and relaxing in the outdoors, with hunting and firearms prohibited. Adventure seekers can access the trail from three trailheads—each equipped with restrooms, parking, and river entry for kayaks and canoes—using either a daily entrance fee or a Texas State Parks Pass.
