Hurst, Texas is a vibrant suburban community in northeastern Tarrant County, situated within the Dallas-Fort Worth metroplex and known for its convenient location just 13 miles from DFW International Airport. With roots dating back to mid-1800s settlements, the city developed around early farming communities and later grew significantly with the arrival of the Rock Island Railroad in 1903, which led to the establishment of the Hurst depot named after local settler William Letchworth Hurst. Today, Hurst blends its rich history with modern amenities, featuring notable destinations such as the North East Mall—one of Texas's largest shopping centers—and a strong educational foundation through the Hurst-Eules-Bedford Independent School District.
